Small Groups at the heart of Discipleship and in the GMC

Dear Congregation,

Last month I conveyed some of the latest facts and news about the Global Methodist Church. This month I want to focus on the GMC vision for



transformational discipleship, which is at the heart of its mission to bring the Gospel to the whole world. Here is how the 2024 Book of Doctrines and Disciplines of the Global Methodist Church describes this work.

¶ 405. TRANSFORMATIONAL DISCIPLESHIP. In light of the mission of the church and our covenant in Christ, the Global Methodist Church engages the commandment to make disciples of Jesus through an intentional process grounded in Scripture and in our Wesleyan heritage. The Global Methodist Church defines a disciple as a person whose life reflects the character of Christ and extends the mission of Christ in holy love of God and neighbor. The disciple's character and practice are informed by the Scriptures, nurtured by the community of faith, and empowered by the Holy Spirit. The disciple's mission is to continue the mission and ministry of Jesus through works of teaching, service, multiplication, mercy, and justice, making more obedient disciples who will reflect the character and mission of Christ and expanding the boundaries of Christ's Kingdom further out into the world. The goal of transformational discipleship ministry in the Global Methodist Church is to make, develop, and nurture disciples of Jesus Christ through small groups where each person is invited, challenged, supported, and held accountable in living sanctified lives that reflect the practices, character, and mission of Christ.

The GMC vision for transformational discipleship accords well with our own church's focus on Small Group Ministry. Since 2018-19, when we instituted our church-wide discipleship plan, we have been encouraging every member and attendee to get involved in a small group. This is a great way to grow in faith, be encouraged in life's challenges, and develop good Christian friends with whom you can share life together. We have more than 20 active small groups, with several open to receiving new members. See our website havenefc.org for more details.

We hope to launch new small groups out of the next Alpha Course, to help attendees continue to grow in faith. Please keep these things in your prayers. If you are not in a small group yet, I strongly encourage you to find one and get involved. You will be blessed.

What's Happening in the Lawsuit June 2025 Update

The judge in the case has certified the lawsuit for a jury trial. A Pre-Trial Settlement Hearing has been scheduled for August 11. If you can attend, it will show the judge our church members really care about this case. At the hearing, the judge could recommend the two sides settle prior to trial, or he could use the hearing to settle on an actual trial date, or to hear any other final motions. The hearing will be held at the Montgomery County Courthouse, Courtroom "G," on August 11 at 3 PM, located at 2 East Airy Street, Norristown, PA, 19404.

What should we be doing in the meantime? Keep doing the work of the Kingdom! Live as faithful disciples, keeping praying, share the good news with those who are open, worship fervently, and do the good works God has prepared for you. Pray for our lawyers and for those who oppose us. Ask the Lord for a favorable outcome.

Safe Driving

Summer is finally here! The summer season is the most popular time for vacation and travel. That means more folks on the road, so heightened awareness and safety while driving are a must. Motor vehicle crashes are a leading cause of death in the USA, making driving risky business. Many motor vehicle accidents are preventable by following safe driving practices.

The safe driving practices to consider are:

- Buckle up! Use safety belts for each rider, everytime.
- Ensure children are in the correct safety seat which is installed accurately. Children under 13 years should always be in the back.
- Maintain a safe following distance.
- Be aware of your surroundings, use your mirrors, be mindful of blind spots, cyclists, pedestrians and other vehicles.
- Plan ahead and know your route. Build stops into your travel plans for rest, food, and phone calls.
- Follow the speed limits.
- Try to remain calm and be courteous. Avoid aggressive driving behavior.
- Do not drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs. It is illegal in all states!
- Do not drive drowsy. Avoid driving if you are tired, as it impairs your judgement and reaction time.
- Pay attention to the road. Minimize distractions such as talking or texting on your phone, eating and drinking, adjusting entertainment devices or the navigation system. Avoid emotional conversations or arguments.

- Good vehicle maintenance is important. Regular checks on oil, tires, brakes, and other fluids are essential to keep your automobile roadworthy and safe.
- Move over if you see flashing lights on a stopped vehicle. If moving over is not safe, slow down. Stop if a school bus has its red flashing lights on and be prepared to stop if its lights are flashing yellow.
- Use turn signals appropriately. It is always good to communicate your intentions to other drivers.
- Drive defensively. Anticipate potential hazards and be prepared to react. This is especially applicable in bad weather.




We are taking the month of July off- there will be no meeting.

ONLINE GIVING NEWS/CHANGES

There are new changes to our Online Giving Platform. As of July 1, we are no longer using Vanco for our online giving. There are several reasons for this change, one of the most important reasons is that Vanco will no longer be compatible with our current record keeping program, Servant Keeper. However, Servant Keeper has added an online giving platform to the existing services that they offer with no extra fees incurred by the church. So, what does that mean for all of you?

- 1. You will need to close your Vanco account
- 2. Please sign up for Servant Keeper online giving at:

https://giving.servantkeeper.com/firstumcsh

or use the QR code at the bottom of this article.

It is easy to do and only takes a few minutes of your time.

Just a reminder, the same is true with SK as with Vanco, there are some fees applied to your giving:

Vanco: 2.79% + \$.45 Servant Keeper: 3% + \$.50 And monthly fee 1% + \$.50 (e-check)

We as a church were paying/year for Vanco services. SK giving (new platform for them), is already included with our Servant Keeper program that we have been using for many years in the office. Hence no additional expense for the church.

There are other perks to creating an online account with Servant Keeper even if you do not want to give online and continue giving with cash or checks on Sunday morning. Once you create your profile on Servant Keeper you can view all your previous years of giving. One person shared that they are able view their giving since 2002!

Your online tithe or gift will be credited directly to your personal profile on SK giving. It has been all along, but someone has had to manually enter the tithe/gift. There will no longer be a need for someone to do this.

If you need to print a statement of your giving for tax purposes or any other purposes you can accomplish this from the comfort of your own home, no more contacting the church office and waiting for someone to print it for you and mail it out or running into the church to pick it up.

We will also have the ability to create special giving categories, such as payments for Youth Camps, Reading Phillies events, capital campaigns etc. We will be exploring these options within the coming weeks and keep you posted on our findings and

additions to the areas of giving that become available.

It is our hope that you will embrace this new giving platform and find it easy to navigate. We welcome your feedback.



CONFIRMATION CLASS 2025



Our team has been hard at work, coming alongside one of our church families whose home and property was severely damaged by several back-to-back, heavy



rain and windstorms. This project gave us an opportunity to hone our skill sets and learn new ones in both construction and landscaping. Under the direction of our crew chief (Brian Callaghan) and assistant (Jeff Berger), the team divided up and fully conquered the massive project ... step by step over the course of four to six weeks (rain was not our friend).

Our roof crew removed the metal piping system on the porch roof and cleared all the wistaria & other debris to make a safe workspace for the needed repairs. Then the siding that was still partially attached to the home was removed, damage repaired, insulation foam boards applied to not only insulate but level the walls and finally, all the siding was reattached to the home.

Our ground crew cleared all the storms' tree limbs and debris, removed all the wistaria on the home and property, pulled weeds, pruned bushes, cleared flower beds and mowed the grass.
