The situation I want to share with you happened recently when a friend asked me a question: "I want to know Jesus like you do." So, in a restaurant parking lot, we prayed the sinner's prayer and then I purchased a commentary on Mark's Gospel which we are now studying together. This friend has pancreatic cancer which has entered into her stomach wall. How long we have together God only knows, but I will see her again.
