Giving to the Church when the Denomination is a Mess

Dear Congregation,

By the end of 2023, estimates are that about 7200 churches will have departed the rapidly liberalizing United Methodist denomination, over 20% of the



30,000 some UM churches in the United States, according to Rev. Jay Therrell, retiring president of the Wesley Covenant Association.¹ News around the country from the Spring-Summer Annual Conference season showed accelerating trends of social and theological 'liberalization,' including several illegal ordinations and bishop consecrations, with traditional voices becoming weaker and weaker as conservative churches and clergy depart the denomination in mass.

With the current delegate ratio, many pundits are projecting the UMC's 2024 General Conference will collapse any remaining orthodox and traditional moral and theological guardrails in the Discipline - at least in the United States. This will open doors wide for the progressive sexual diversity agenda in the US already present in rebellious annual conferences, even if it alienates more culturally conservative American and international United Methodists. As a result, my guess is that millions more American members will gradually exit the denomination, just as has happened in the UCC, Presbyterian USA, and Episcopalian denominations. If the church stands for nothing different from the world, why bother? Future conflict with African United Methodism seems inevitable, but who knows? Either way, the handwriting seems to be on the wall for United Methodism's further rapid decline and irrelevance in the US.

As most of you surely know by now, our church's Administrative Board voted for our church to join a group lawsuit with about 55 other churches suing in Pennsylvania Civil Court to get out of the EPA Annual Conference of the UMC. They made this decision after numerous congregational straw polls showed total unanimity of desire to exit the UMC. I and others have written about this in past newsletters, and you can read those in the online database on the church's website if you need more information.

The legal process to get out is not fast. The church must wait patiently and let the lawyers (and God!) do their work. In the meantime, the Ad Board also voted to withhold the church's share of apportionments to the Annual Conference and General Church, keeping them in escrow until the legal battle resolves.

How has this impacted you as a giving member of our local church? Our church has a long history of conscientious objection and indignation with the EPA Conference/UMC, going all the way back to the 1990s and the "Sophia" controversy. In response, even at that time, some members stopped giving to the church's general fund, because they did not want any of their money to end up in the coffers of the EPA Conference. (Our church's apportionments to the conference and General church make up about 9% of our annual budget.) Instead, they redirected their giving into things like 'building' or 'depreciation.'

UM Discipline (!) requires churches to honor the designated giving wishes of donors. For many years, this 'directed' giving pattern has created a challenge for the Finance Committee to balance the budget, since designated giving can leave some non-budget funds flush while the general fund supporting the budget is underfunded. This seems to be the case again this year. So far, total giving to support the 2023 budget is significantly down, though non-budget designated giving is strong, and we suspect some members are withholding or redirecting their support for the same "conscience" reasons.

With all this background, I invite you to reconsider what and why you give to the church, including while the church is in this transition season. I know it is frustrating to witness injustice and corruption in high places - whether it is in the church, denomination, or in civil life and government. We want to express that somehow. But the failures of those 'above' does not excuse our own call to be faithful and generous in supporting the work of God's kingdom, and to be responsible for resources God has given us. They will answer for themselves. We will answer for ourselves. Has God called you to be part of this church? Then give to his work in it. If you are benefiting in any way from the blessings and ministries of the church, then give to support it. It is an imperfect church made up of imperfect people in an imperfect denomination, but it is striving to 'move on to perfection' by working to follow Jesus, including working hard to align with a more biblically faithful denomination.

If as a matter of conscience, you still do not want your money to go to the conference or General Church offices, (even bearing in mind no apportionments are being paid right now), you can direct your giving to support some other part of the church's budget – the remaining 91% – whether it be for programs, personnel, legal help, office, worship, technology,

missions, outreach, discipleship, etc. I hope most people will not feel they need to do this because it creates an accounting headache for our finance people, but if it is what you must do to keep a clear conscience, that is an option. This has the added benefit of not punishing the local church for denominational actions beyond its control.

Regarding that clear conscience, I want to remind you that the United Methodist Church has not yet 'crossed the redline' into apostacy of doctrine and practice. It may do so soon - at GC2024, but not vet. Individual clergy, bishops, and even annual conferences are flouting their 'enlightened' rebellion, but they are doing so by *disobeying* United Methodist Discipline. You can trust God to deal with those who violate his covenant in due time. To be sure, the breakdown of our polity is accelerating. But as an ordained elder in the UMC, I can still in good conscience say I vastly agree with and will uphold the Discipline. When that changes, I will be re-evaluating my ordination credentials. But for now, we all still experience some benefits by being United Methodist, even if it is in things as mundane as shared and cheaper property insurance, orderly governance structure, and the rich Methodist tradition we've inherited. I still serve as a 'man under authority' – appointed under the authority of the Annual Conference and bishop. We are 'sailing for new land' with our current plans, so let's give all we have to make sure our ship survives on the way and thrives after it gets there.

As we head into September, the Stewardship and Finance Committee of the church will be asking all of us to consider our giving commitment to the Church for the coming year. In closing, I invite you to consider what your giving really means, and why it is such an important part of your spiritual life. I invite you to prayerfully commit to give in proportion to how God has blessed you. After all, he is the one who gave you the power to produce. Your giving to the work of the Lord is a sign, among other things, of your spiritual maturity in generosity, of your commitment to further the church's Gospel mission, and of your love for God and his people. When you put your money in God's hands by giving it away to his work, it blesses others and shows you honor him and put him first as Lord of your finances. He will bless you for it.

Faith Community Nurse's Notes

Preparing for the Cold and Flu Season

Fall is approaching and unfortunately, the cold and flu season along with it! With that in mind, you may want to take some steps to be prepared.

Trying to maintain your health is always the first step. Eat a healthy diet, exercise regularly, try to get enough sleep, and maintain good body and oral hygiene. Keep health maintenance visits with your primary care providers as well as specialists such as cardiologists, endocrinologists, etc...

Speak to your physician about getting a flu vaccine and any other adult immunizations that are recommended based upon your age and health issues. Flu vaccines are a yearly vaccine and are manufactured according to the current information available regarding influenza for the year.

Gear up against germs! The golden rule for keeping yourself and others healthy is WASH YOUR HANDS, WASH YOUR HANDS, WASH YOUR HANDS! When you are out and about doing life, it requires touching all different types of things, from shopping carts, telephones, doors etc. All those surfaces can be loaded with germs that cause cold, flu, COVID and gastrointestinal ailments. A good habit is to wash your hands upon returning home. Wash them thoroughly for 20 seconds at least. Also wash your hands after using the restroom, before eating, and after using a tissue for wiping your nose or to cough into.

Clean and disinfect your home regularly. Some multipurpose cleaners remove physical dirt but do not actually kill viruses or illness causing bacteria. It is important that the cleaning product label states that it disinfects.!

Scrub kitchen and bathroom sinks. Make sure to include the faucet handles and area surrounding the sink, kitchen counter tops, and cooking areas. Other areas to focus on are frequently touched surfaces. These would include door knobs, light switches, TV remotes, handles on the refrigerator, microwave, dishwasher and oven. Be sure the sponges or rag you are using are clean and disinfected!

There are disinfectant sprays that can be used on soft surfaces such as upholstered furniture. This is an especially good practice if someone in your household is actively coughing or sneezing.

Prevention is key to fighting cold and flu!

I am more convinced than ever that there is no tougher job, and no greater calling than that of a parent. The powerful role a parent plays in their child's life cannot be overestimated. Your kids are drawing their cues on what it looks like to follow Christ from you more than they are any other person. This can be an incredibly motivating, convicting, and overwhelming thought. You won't always get it right or perfect. Pastor Mark Batterson once said, "You'll never be a perfect parent, but you need to be a praying parent."

We send our kids off on their first day of school with all of the supplies they need to be fully equipped and prepared to make the most of the year that is ahead of them. Why would we not do the same to spiritually equip and prepare them as they walk into the world?

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Ephesians 6:13-17

Are you feeling like being a praying parent is just as much of a challenge as a perfect parent? Here are some easy first steps to take this school year...

- 1. **Pray** an armor of God prayer over your child by inserting their name into the Scripture above and asking God to help them daily.
- Ask questions that can help you kickstart meaningful conversations and prayers with your kids. (Remember timing is everything. Sometimes, your kid may need some time to decompress from their day. Read their cues and find the right time to have these conversations.)

What are you most excited about right now?

This might just be the best (and easiest) jumping off point for connection. Ask the question and be prepared to listen...for a while. After all, kids are often bursting with excitement about one thing or another. Pray Jeremiah 29:11 over your child and ask God to help you guide them into the perfect plan He has for their life.

What's making you worried lately?

Kids are happy-go-lucky creatures, but they also have things they're affected by. Asking this question gives credibility to your concerns and helps your kid work through their emotions in a safe environment. Consider taking their concerns (and yours) to the Lord as you meditate on Philippians 4:6-8.

These questions are just a starting point that will hopefully break through the distracted exterior and help you to get to the heart of the matter and provide a foundation for meaningful prayer in your child's life.

Our theme this year is "Opening the storehouse of God's Blessings".


