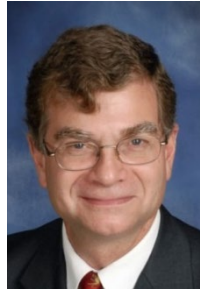


Pastor's Pen

Re-igniting Sunday School for all Ages in the New Year



Dear Congregation,

In the fall newsletter, I wrote about our plans to revitalize Christian Education for all ages. I am pleased to announce that we are re-igniting our **Sunday School program**, kickoff date scheduled for January 25, 2026, 10:30 AM. The new program will offer Christian ed and discipleship classed for all ages, with something for everyone, including children's and contemporary worship opening program, refreshments, and coffeehouse and other small group opportunities for spiritual growth, including a new members class. Here is the new Sunday morning schedule beginning 1/25/2026:

- **9:00 AM** -Celebration worship service in the sanctuary
- **10-10:30** -Fellowship and refreshments in Fellowship Hall
- **10:30 AM** -Opening Coffeehouse "All-ages" worship for combined Sunday School and Coffeehouse group in Fellowship Hall
- **10:45 AM** – Christian Ed/Sunday School classes for all ages begin, scattered throughout the church building
- **11:45 AM** – Morning programs conclude

Many thanks to those who have answered the call to lead and teach in the new program. We will very likely need more volunteers. **Please prayerfully consider helping** if you are at all able and sign up. Jesus loves all ages, including the little children, and it is a privilege and blessing to serve him by training the next generation of disciples, beginning with those children.

Important TRAINING reminder: All volunteers in children and youth ministry must be trained or retrained in the "Safe-Sanctuary" Policy of the church. The training is **required** by the church and must be renewed for all leaders, volunteers and staff every three years. The next training is scheduled for **two Sundays, January 11 & 18, 2026, at 10:30 am in Fellowship Hall**. Free lunch included. More details can be found in the pages that follow. REQUIRED "SAFE SANCTUARY & LEADERS" TRAINING

(FIRST-TIME & RENEWAL)

For All Leaders, Staff, Teachers, & Volunteers in Children's, Youth and Vulnerable Adult Ministry

Sunday, January 11 and 18, 10:30 AM

Lunch provided

It is time to renew and/or receive first-time "Safe-Sanctuary" AND Leaders training. This is mandatory for all leaders, professional staff, teachers, and for all volunteers in children's and youth ministry, and volunteers working with vulnerable adults, required whether you are new to volunteering or have had the training before (it must be renewed every three years). **All leaders, staff, teachers,**

and anyone who wishes to begin or continue volunteering or working with children or youth ministry or with vulnerable adults MUST TAKE THIS TRAINING! Small Groups leaders are also strongly encouraged to attend.

Because of the amount of material we need to cover, we are scheduling **two Sundays on January 11 & 18 for these sessions. Begins at 10:30 am in Fellowship Hall.** Light lunch included. The training covers:

- Safe Sanctuary training mandated by the EPA Annual Conference
- Leadership Ethics Expectations
- Training for safe personal boundaries for ministry
- State mandated reporting requirements concerning discovery of various types of harm, including suspected abuse and threat of suicide
- Background check requirements
- Internet safety standards and new risks and safety protocols in the church context
- HIPPA Privacy Act awareness in ministry and confidentiality
- Reporting procedures for ministry crisis events
- Power dynamics and leadership dating standards
- Conflict resolution best practices
- Review of “armed shooter” safety protocol

Please make every effort to attend this vital training if you wish to be involved in any way in leadership or helping in ministry with children, youth, or vulnerable adults. The training will be recorded. Thank you.

Finance Committee Update

So far, to date, 38 Statement of Intent cards were received offering approximately \$258,200 toward the 2026 budget. As a reference, our 2025 budget was \$469,159 and \$255,544 was pledged. We were able to come in below budget for 2025. The 2026 budget was set below the 2025 level. The final budget will be available for viewing in the office at the beginning of the New Year.

In March, we are planning to go to the Works (Reading) for some fun with go-karts, arcade and food. In April, we will have a lock-in event planned.

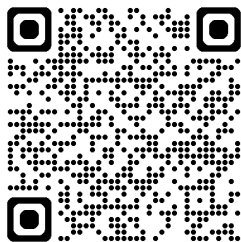

Faith Community Nurse Notes

February is considered the heart month in the USA. The heart is a truly interesting part of our body. It starts beating at 5 weeks of fetal development and can be detected beating via an ultrasound at 6 to 7 weeks. The important work continues for the rest of life. Some interesting facts about the heart:

- It is a powerful muscle that beats 100,000 times a day.
- It pumps 2,000 gallons of blood daily (enough to fill a tanker truck).
- It has 4 chambers, 2 atria and 2 ventricles.
- It has 4 valves which function like a one way pump.
- The right side of the heart pumps blood to the lungs.
- The left side of the heart pumps oxygenated blood to the body.
- The heart has it's own electrical system which creates the impulses to beat.
- Adult resting heart rate is 60-100 per minute.
- An adult heart is the size of 2 hands clasped together.
- The heart is located behind the breast bone and it's tilted to the left.
- Laughing is good for your heart because the blood vessels relax during laughter and relaxed blood vessels allow the heart not to work as hard.

- The word “heart” appears in the Bible 700-1000 times depending on the translation.

Biblically, the heart is the core of your being. What you do, actions and reactions as well as what you say, think, and feel come from the heart. Matthew 12:34-35 (CEV) “Your words show what is in your hearts. Good people bring good things out of their hearts, but evil people bring evil out of their hearts.” What is in your heart becomes your life! It is also recognized as the part of a person that connects with God and other people. Proverbs 3:5 (NIV) “Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding.” Romans 10:10 (ESV) “For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved.”

Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life. Proverbs 5:23 (NIV)
